Mistake #3: Choosing Materials on Aesthetics Alone

Have you verified:

- Materials are moisture-resistant and bathroom-appropriate?
- Tile has proper slip resistance rating?
- Cabinetry is built for bathroom environments?
- Finishes can withstand humidity and cleaning products?
- Materials have realistic maintenance requirements?

Mistake #4: Ignoring Layout Change Costs

Layout decisions:

- I'm keeping current fixture locations (saves money)
- I'm moving fixtures (have I added \$8,000-15,000+ to budget?)
- I've received detailed estimates for any layout changes
- I understand moving a toilet alone costs \$2,000-4,000+

Mistake #6: Overlooking Cabinetry Quality

- Ensured exhaust fan vents to exterior (not attic)?

Mistake #9: Making Changes During Construction

Commitment to avoid changes:

- I've made ALL selections before construction starts
- I understand mid-project changes add 15-30% to costs
- I've viewed all samples in my actual bathroom lighting
- I've documented every decision in writing
- I'll resist temptation to upgrade during construction

Mistake #10: Choosing Wrong Contractor/Going Too Low

Contractor selection:

- I've obtained at least 3 detailed bids
- I've checked licenses and insurance

- I've verified references (minimum 3)
- I've read online reviews
- I understand lowest bid ≠ best value
- I have detailed contract with specifications
- Contractor specializes in bathrooms
